



The fuels thinning crew thinned approximately 2,000 acres over the decade while I worked there. We also built some hiking trails in the Mission Canyon. I had the best job in the world until someone talked me into running for the tribal council as the Mountain Gros Ventre Representative. I was elected in 2015 and served four consecutive two year terms ending in 2023. I am currently employed by the FBIC Orphaned Wells Program as a GIS Technician. I look forward to serving my community on the board.
